Read through the story, complete the tasks and then create your own detective story, using the resources on the next page!

The Davenport family live in a vast, secluded mansion in South Manchester. The mansion is palatial and is truly something to behold. The Davenport estate owns many priceless paintings, sculptures and many antique artefacts. The family also own a range of jewellery and expensive cars.

The family have a substantial collection, as you can see, there are paintings and sculptures everywhere! Look closely at the pictures below. Make a list of the items you notice that could be of value.







It was midsummer (the longest day of the year) and the house was ready for festivities, the annual Davenport Summer Solstice Ball. Every year, there was a massive party held in the mansion for the friends and business acquaintances of the family. There were hundreds of guests and the party was swinging until the early hours. Task 1

Mind map what you know about detectives. If you don't know very much, it would be a good idea to ask someone at home, or to do some research.

Task 2

Design your detective. Use the sheet on the next page to design the detective.

Task 3

Plan your story. You can do this in lots of different ways, but it would be useful to try and answer these questions first: Who could have stolen the necklace? What possible motive could they have? Where would your story start? What kind of person do you think the criminal might be? How would you make sure that the story answers all of the questions (you might choose to leave it on a clff-hanger)?

Task 4

Time to write. Remember to really focus on the vocabulary that you use and really think about how you describe the settings and the way your character moves.

Task 5

Read your story back. Is there anything that you could improve? Ask somebody at home if you can read them the story and ask them for some advice.

Task 6

Bring the story to Whalley Range in September. Your new English teacher would love to see it.

The Mystery of the Disappearing Diamonds Detective Design Sheet


Before you begin writing, it's a good idea to give your character a back story. Answer the questions before you begin writing.
