Curriculum



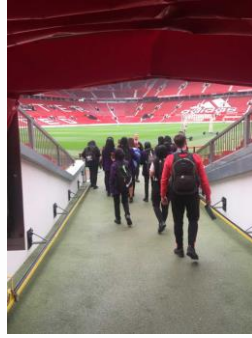
- We offer a broad and balanced curriculum in Year 7
- Students study the core subjects of English, Mathematics and Science.
- All students also study History, Geography, a Modern Foreign language (French, German or Spanish), Physical Education, Religious Education, Design Technology, Computer Science, Art, Music and Drama

Homework



- Students will receive homework from each of their year 7 subjects.
- We ask that you support your daughter by providing her with a quiet place to complete her homework.
- Students are provided with a Journey Journal to record their homework and get into good organisational habits.
- Edulink one can be used by parents/carers to see what homework has been set and the deadlines for the homework.
- Our Learning Resource Centre is open until 5:15pm daily with full access to computers for students to complete their homework.

Trips and Visits



- Rewards trips celebrate positive engagement and progress. Our students have enjoyed a range of trips including Alton Towers, a beach trip, ice skating, cinema visit and Blackpool.
- Academic trips including visits to universities, the WW2 history trip to France and Belgium and language trips to Spain, France and Germany, as well as to a range of places of worship around Manchester.
- Our partnerships with the Manchester United Foundation, Deloitte and other organisations allow students to visit businesses and institutions.
