# SCIENCE JORFILL BANKS

In April, the whole of Year 8 had an amazing trip to Jodrell Bank. Owned by the University of Manchester, Jodrell Bank is a unique and awe-inspiring place, producing cutting-edge research into the Sun, stars, exoplanets, and galaxies. It is also a UNESCO World Heritage Site in recognition of the scientific achievements that have taken place there and its internationally important heritage.

During the day, students were able to walk around the famous Lovell radio telescope and some were lucky enough to see it moving and spot a group of special visitors climbing up into the disk! The students found out how the radio telescope was built and how it helped in the discovery of quasars -- super massive black holes surrounding by orbiting gas.

Groups spent time exploring various interactive exhibitions to learn about the life and death of stars, our solar system, galaxies, nebula and other objects in the universe. There was a special talk from one of the Jodrell bank team and students were really engaged, asking lots of interesting questions which showed their passion for science! This all tied in wonderfully with their school lessons on light and space. Students chose a topic inspired by their Jodrell Bank visit to research in lessons. Groups then presented their

new-found knowledge as part of a science competition, with the winners from each class going through to the overall final.

FUTURES **DXC teamed up with Manchester United Foundation to inspire** and enable young people to become the next generation of leaders. Engaging with the young people, the 4-year partnership programme helps to shape the future of work by developing key digital and social skills.

At the end of 2023, Arissa was successful in joining the Street Games Youth Advisory Board as an advisor, inputting to national policy around youth community sport and engagement.

In May, the Year 8 and 9 Athletics team enjoyed a successful event at Sportscity.


This was a positive experience and there was a fantastic team atmosphere. A special congratulations to Luna who won gold in the long jump
