Reading

Reading continues to be at the heart of everything that we do at Whalley Range. Students across all year groups have had the opportunity to read different texts for both pleasure and progress, which has been demonstrated by the fact that most students' reading ages have increased faster than students' actual ages.

However, it is crucial that all the fantastic enthusiasm and enjoyment that our students have shown for reading over the last few months is not lost over the half-term break. Your daughter should have the opportunity to read as often as possible and, as parents, there are lots of things that you can do to support your daughter's enjoyment of reading:



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- Encourage your daughter to read a book for pleasure (this can be fiction or non-fiction). Perhaps she could borrow a book from the local library?
- Model reading aloud to your daughter
- Encourage your daughter to read aloud to you and ask her questions about the story and characters
- Encourage your daughter to create storyboards or reviews of books that she has enjoyed
- For parents of year 7 students, you could also encourage your daughter to become
 one of our 'Bright Sparx', engaging with the wide range of fiction texts available
 through our new reading platform, Sparx Reader.

Just setting aside 30 minutes each day for your daughter to read for pleasure could have a dramatic impact on her enjoyment of reading and her literacy skills.

Charity

Our amazing students have continued to raise money to support the **UNICEF's Gaza Appeal: Children in Crisis**. So far, they have raised **£2262.45** with more charity events planned in half term 4.

Year 11 have also organised a series of money raising events to support their Prom. So far, they have raised £967.44.

Sixth Form

The Sixth form team have worked hard in supporting the Year 13 students as they complete their UCAS forms for university. So far 90 applications have been submitted.

Year 11 students have been applying for college, and we are delighted once again to have received 444 applications to our Sixth Form, with many Year 11 students already having had their interviews. Any remaining Year 11 students who wish to apply, will need to complete a Late Application form and should contact the 6th form as soon as possible

CHECKLIST: UNIFORM AND EQUIPMENT

All students should:

- Wear a school blazer at all times, including breaks and lunchtimes whilst in the school building
- Wear a white shirt
- Wear a school tie

- Not wear piercings
- Not wear false eyelashes
- Not wear nail polish or acrylic nails
- Not wear hair that is of an extreme style
